- 2. Entries will close at 11.30am sharp. To enable judging to start promptly, NO entries will be taken after this time.
- 3. Once judging has started, no person shall be admitted to the hall or tent until the prizes have been awarded, except the Judges and the Stewards deputed by the Committee to receive, class and place the specimens in order for exhibition.
- 4. The Show will be closed at 4.30pm, and no exhibits or prize tickets may be removed before that time.
- 5. Prize money will be paid commencing at 4.30pm on the day of the Show, unless there is an objection to any specimen that has taken a prize. Exhibitors who have not claimed their prize money within 14 days will forfeit same to the Hall funds.
- 6. Ages, for the childrenøs classes, will be taken as on Show Day.
- 7. Exhibitors breaking any rule will (if detected) forfeit all prizes that they win. All objections must be made to the Secretary in writing before 4.30pm on the Show day, with a deposit of £2.00. If the objection is not proved, the deposit goes to the Hall funds. The decision of the Committee is final, and is subject to no appeal at law.
- 8. The Judgeøs decision is final.
- 9. All exhibits, personal property etc. shall be left at the risk of the exhibitors, and the Hall Committee shall not be liable for any compensation for any loss, damage or injury from any cause whatsoever. Should the Show not be held for any reason, no exhibitor shall have any claim on the Show Committee.
- 10. When the entries in a class consist of only one specimen, it shall not be entitled to a prize, unless deemed worthy by the Judges. If there are only four entries or under, the Judges will have the option of awarding only First and Second prizes.
- 11. The Committee reserves to themselves the right of admitting to any premises taken by the Committee, any person desiring to enter for the purpose of trading, and to charge such person (on being admitted) a sum to be determined by the Committee.
